Hello, and welcome to the first newsletter of the Horshader Community Growing Project! It has been a very exciting and productive first few months, so read on for project updates and details of forthcoming events.

Project Progress

The solardome and polycrubs have now been constructed at the Grinnibhat South Shawbost site and at Dalmore. Raised beds have been installed in two of the polycrubs at South Shawbost and transplanting of young plants including lettuces, tomatoes, onions, peas, beans, cabbages, cauliflower, and broccoli has taken place. It's all looking fantastic, as you can see below!



Raised beds will be completed in the remaining three polycrubs at Grinnibhat and the polycrubb at Dalmore within the next couple of weeks. We have recently taken delivery of fruit plants and trees, which will be planted as soon as the raised beds are finished. Now that the produce is in and growing, it would be fantastic for those of you who have gardening expertise to come and share your knowledge and skills!
